

March Program Preview Sam Borstein

2015 Jim Smith Endowment Fund Recipient

Sam Borstein has been around Cichlids his entire 24 years. His father, Rick, is a serious Cichlid hobbyist, who spoke at one of our meetings a few years ago. Sam, however, is taking things a giant step farther: As a graduate student at California State University, Sacramento, under Dr. Ron Coleman (who spoke here a few months ago) Sam made several trips to Costa Rica to study the local cichlids. He is currently a PhD candidate in the department of Ecology and Evolutionary Biology at the University of Tennessee, Knoxville.

As a hobbyist, Sam keeps and breeds Cichlids (and other fish) from all over the world, but New World Cichlids are his main focus. Like his dad, Sam is active in the organized hobby. He is already a Master Breeder in the Greater Chicago Cichlid Association. Besides the GCCA, he belongs to the American Cichlid Association and the Chicago Livebearer Society. In addition, he is the Secretary of the Federation of American Aquarium Societies.

Sam also has an active on-line presence. His website, http://www.borstein.info, includes profiles of many of the Cichlids he has worked with, both Old World and Neo-tropical, in which he describes his personal experiences with the species. There are additional articles and videos on his blog, http://fish4thought.wordpress.com. The entries cover his field experiences, conventions and other trips, research, fish room and just about anything Cichlid related that pops into his imagination. He also has articles posted on the GCCA's outstanding website.

Here's Sam's description of his presentation:

The Lake Victorian Extinction: In the 1950's the Nile perch was introduced into Lake Victoria and quickly became one of the worst invasive species in the world. The introduction of the Nile perch into Lake Victoria led to one of the largest extinction events in recent times, the extinction of hundreds of native cichlid species found only in Lake Victoria. It has traditionally been thought that the massive Nile perch, which can grow to six feet in length, simply ate the much smaller cichlid species to extinction. This talk will discuss how predation by Nile perch is not the only reason so many cichlid species went extinct and that a morphological trait that is thought to be responsible for cichlids becoming so diverse may have played a major role. This talk will discuss how using new methods, like 3D printing and hi-speed video, allowed for a better understanding of what caused one of the largest recent extinction events. Additionally, there will be a discussion on keeping some new Victorian cichlid species that have been imported into the hobby as well as those that are extinct in the wild yet available in the hobby.



Next month, Ray "Kingfish" Lucas will be on hand to regale us with tales from his many years of association with the aquarium hobby and with the hobbyist community.





Pleco-Proof Your Sponge Filter By Bob Blazek

Hello Everyone! Have you ever looked in you aquarium and saw your favorite Pleco nose first in the lift tube on a sponge filter? I know that it's happened more than once to me. Sometimes you have found it in time to save it, other times not. Fortunately for me I don't keep expensive Plecos, just the common species. I would really be upset if it were a high-end species. So here's what I've come up with and it's been working great. It's pretty simple and all you need is an extra piece of airline and an extra ATI part called a "Bulls Eye." You can order the Bulls Eye from Kens Fish. The following pictures should help you understand what to do, instead of me rambling on forever trying to explain in words.



First you need a sponge filter



Connect



Then a 5" airline & ATI Bulls Eye



And you're done!

Never lost one yet since doing this –and the ATI Bulls eye are only \$1.00. I recommend cutting I" off lift tube & airline for 10 gallon tanks. Use a fine tooth hacksaw blade. I hope this was helpful!

Held Prisoner by Convicts By Jonathan Strazinsky

I know what you're thinking, why convicts? Why write an article about Amatitlania Nigrofasciatum? For me they mark the beginning of my cichlid addiction back in 1986, when my pair of convicts spawned in a 15 gallon tank in my bedroom! The male was a pink convict and the female was a grey. I raised the fry in that 15 gallon aquarium and moved the parents to a 30 gallon that had a small Oscar in it. They promptly killed the little guy. My first lesson in mixing cichlids together did not go too well. Just because they were the



same size doesn't mean they'd be ok together! What I didn't realize was the convicts were mature and the Oscar was still a baby.

Back to that first cichlid spawn of mine. Interestingly enough that pair threw marbled fry, or calico they're sometimes called. I raised about 25 of them and took them back to my local pet store down the street to sell them. Much to my chagrin I was told they were hybrids and they would never sell! About 10 years later I found myself in Aquarium Adventure, where they were selling marble convicts for \$8.99 each! Of course I bought some, since they had a deal on buying six! I raised and spawned them but unfortunately due to some circumstances in my life at the time, I had to get rid of all my fish and tanks. A few years later I was able to get a few tanks set up and eventually a fish room. For the better part of the

last fifteen years, I've always had some form of convict in the fish room! Sure, they're easy to spawn! So easy, in fact, that I actually won a five dollar bet by spawning them in a bucket! To this day I still get excited when I see they've got fry or eggs!



One thing they do have going for them is they're extremely hardy. Years ago I used to get a live tree every year for Christmas. I watered the trees with water from the fish tanks after doing water changes. It was great for the trees and, as a matter of fact, it's great for your house plants and plants in your garden! I'd just fill up a five gallon pail, hide it behind the Christmas tree, and water when necessary! One year it had been well over a



week since the tree had been set up and I knew it was time to water it. There, in the bucket behind the tree, was three little convict fry swimming around in the few inches of ice cold water that was left! On the flip side, just recently, I had a heater malfunction in one of my tanks. Once I discovered it, the water was upwards of 93 degrees! In that tank the convicts had a huge clutch of fry in the back left hand corner of the tank thriving! They were seemingly unfazed by the massive jump in temperature and just went about their normal business!



If you've never kept convicts or spawned them I'd like to encourage you to give them a try! I currently have a spawn of both marble and grey convicts in the fish room. I'd be glad to give you a handful to raise and spawn. It'd be a fun experience for all of you out there who have only kept mouth brooding African cichlids! You just never know, you might enjoy them so much you too could be held prisoner by the little convict like I have for the past 30 years!
