# A Word from the President...

Lew Carbone, OCA President

#### Greetings, OCA Members

It's time for our winter auction! Because the  $1^{st}$  of the month is on a Saturday, this year's auction is a little later than usual, and will be held on Saturday the  $15^{th}$ . As usual, it will be in the big room at the Strongsville Holiday Inn, the exact same place as the Extravaganza auction. **The split for OCA members will be 75/25 (sellers get 75%)**, while non-members' split will be the standard 70/30. The dollar per lot seller fee will still be in effect for all participants, because it has proven effective in cutting down on the low-value items. This prevents the auction from bogging down, so it doesn't last past the time that anyone wants to be there, lower selling prices for everyone.

Unlike the Extravaganza auction, this auction will allow useable dry goods, including aquariums, as well as cichlids, catfish and plants. See the rules for other restrictions. **For your convenience, you will find a condensed version of the rules later in this bulletin.** It includes a step-by-step description of what to do when you arrive at the auction with your fish to sell. One of the most important parts is the request that <u>all</u> the information be located close together on your auction lot. This helps the auctioneer who has only seconds to get ready to try to sell your item at the highest price possible.

There will be a new feature at the meeting this month: A 50/50 Raffle to benefit the Jim Smith Fund. Jonathan "Jombie" Dietrich, the OCA Secretary and Bulletin Editor, will be handling it most months, and we'll have someone else filling it when he can't. Our Membership Chair and Librarian Hilary Lacerda will take care of it this month. This was inspired by the hugely successful 50/50 raffle run by Jonathan Strazinsky at this past Extravaganza. Newer members might be interested to know that the Jim Smith Endowment fund raises money that ends up as grants to people and organizations who are planning projects that would further research, education and conservation concerning cichlids and/or catfish. The drawing will be held right before the mini-auction begins. A convenient time to get some extra cash, don't you think?



**OCA Monthly Bowl Show**

OCA Membership,

Please find the results of the 2019 Monthly Bowl Show Result above. I can tell you the competition near the end of the year between the three was lots of fun. As such we have decided to make the rules a little different to help foster bring in show fish each month.

Some of the major changes include:

- 1. In order to win any of the end of the year prizes you must earn points in at least three-monthly shows. This is to make sure we are seeing more fish throughout the year.
- 2. This year I am asking for a label in front of the display tank that has the species name, what class it is being entered, and lastly the name of the person(s) submitting the entry on the back of the label. This will help with awarding points and cash prizes.
- 3. The number of entries per person(s) in any given month is going to be limited to six.

If you have any questions on the rule changes, please let me know. The more feedback we get the better we can make this event in the future. I will be attempting to update everyone monthly on the standings.

#### 2020 OCA Monthly Bowl Show Competition Rules

The primary purpose of the bowl show is educational and practice for the annual Extravaganza. It enables members to see and examine different species of fish, it familiarizes members as to judging procedures. In addition to encouraging the showing and keeping of fish.

- 1. The Bowl Show Chairman, or designated appointee for a specific month, shall have complete charge of all entries. Any unusual requirements or exceptions or questions about these rules must be discussed with the chairperson.
- 2. All entries shall be in containers having at least 1 flat side (not including the bottom). Only one fish per container, unless a full divider is used then only one fish per section of the container. It's also a good idea to have some form of lid for your animal's protection.
- 3. All containers must be devoid of contents, except for water and fish. A background, outside of the container, is allowed. However, special lighting is not allowed.
- 4. A label (piece of paper) should be placed in front of each entry giving the scientific name and the class the fish is being entered. The owner's name (the person[s] receiving points) of the entry should be placed on the back of the label.
- 5. Only members in good standing and present at the monthly meeting may submit an entry.
- 6. No more than 6 entries may be submitted by any one member during a monthly show.
- 7. Entries must be owned by the person(s) submitting it for judging. In addition, the last permeant residence of the entry must be from an aquarium maintained by the owner(s).
- 8. The chairperson, from time to time, may ask for guest judges in helping to award points. However, the final decision to award any points is the responsibility of the chairperson.
- 9. Each month different categories, typically Cichlids and Catfish, will be judged. Checkout the most current listing for monthly classes.
- 10. Size restrictions refer to full-grown adult sizes as reported by Cichlid Room Companion or Planet Catfish.
- 11. A fish can be entered in only one of the available classes, each month.
- 12. Diseased, malformed, mutilated, hybrid specimens, or other reasonable grounds may be cause for disqualification of an entry. If an entry is disqualified, then all points and cash prizes accumulated for that month's show will be forfeit by the owner(s) that submitted the entry.
- 13. The decision of the chairperson is FINAL.
- 14. Monthly Point awards and cash prizes: (OCA to potentially award \$81, and 65 points to all placing entries, per month)



#### 15. Yearly Point awards and prizes:

- 1. Grand Prize for 2020: 75-gallon aquarium or cash equivalent. To qualify for the grand prize, you must have earned points in at least three separate monthly shows.
- 2. A Certificate (or plaque) will be awarded to the OCA Bowl Show Champion (overall point leader for the year). To qualify for the certificate, you must have earned points in at least three separate monthly shows.
- 3. Certificates may be awarded to the 1<sup>st</sup> runner-up in the yearly point totals. To qualify for a certificate, you must have earned points in at least three separate monthly shows and have at least half the total points as the overall point leader.
- 4. For tie breakers, the number of monthly awards won will be utilized starting with Best of Show.



This auction is for cichlids, catfish, plants and usable dry-goods only. Hybrids are not accepted, except for aquarium strains of Peacocks, Discus and Ancistrus. Anything else becomes a donation.

1" minimum on fish, 5-bag maximum of each species/morph, 60 item limit per family. Please double-bag. 1/3 water, 2/3 air. We will re-bag if necessary, and you'll be charged \$3. Fill out a Seller Form. It's best to download it at the above link, but you can get one there. Label items with 3-letter seller code and 2-digit number, eg ABC-01. Include genus, species, location/morph, and common name, as appropriate. Include number of fish, by sex if known. "Breeders" must have successfully spawned. Place all info close together on the bag. Somewhere else on the bag, include name and phone number if you want. Registration is from 10:00 to Noon. Auction begins at 11:00.

When you arrive:

1. If you haven't filled out a Seller Form, get one from the registration table and fill it out.

2. Go to the registration table and give the required info and let them see your Seller Form. You can register to sell and/or to run a tab as a buyer. They will give you colored stickers to put on your items before check-in.

3. Put the stickers on your items.

4. Go to check-in. Your items will be inspected for compliance with rules and secure

bagging, and the Seller Form will be collected.

Minutes before the auction begins, the 1st color will be randomly chosen, and bags with that colored stickers will be auctioned 1st. Other colors will be chosen at random when needed. "Express" stickers will be sold at the registration table, for \$3, beginning at 11:00. If you want a bag to be auctioned off right away, purchase a sticker, give it to a staff member working by the tables, and show him/her the bag you want to Express. Then, pay attention, because it will be auctioned within the next 10 minutes.

**If you are not selling**, and you'd like to run a tab, go to the registration table to arrange that. Split: 1st \$1 plus 30% (25% if you're an OCA member) of the rest goes to the club, the remaining amount will be mailed to you within 2 weeks.

All donations go to the **Jim Smith Endowment Fund**, which supports cichlid and catfish research, conservation and education.

## LABEL YOUR BAGS CLEARLY!

Bags can be labeled with labels or permanent marker. Put all the information close together on the bag.

Include lot number, scientific name, common name, morph, and/or location, number and sex as appropriate. "Pair" means male and female, "trio" means male and 2 females, "reverse trio" means 2 males and 1 female. Groups marked as breeders must have produced viable fry. Include your name and phone number somewhere on the bag. Among other things, this shows you are confident in the quality of your offering.



#### CARES News January 2020

We would like to give a big thank you to Don Danko of the Ohio Cichlid Association who suggested publishing a CARES Newsletter and offered a space for it in the OCA's Buckeye Bulletin. The premise is that organizations have an ongoing column at their disposal, put forth by the CARES team, that shares CARES happenings.

To begin, we join the rest of the world in our worry and concern (understatement of the millennia) with regards to the wildfires burning unabated in Australia. This is directly opposite of the CARES direction. If you are not willing to commit long-term, you are taxing other people with unnecessary work when it comes to the verification and data update aspects of our organization. This takes attention away from participants that truly are CARES minded and in it to achieve the organization's goals of preserving a future for conservation priority fish. This is not to discourage participation, only to remind interested persons of the expectations on the entrant's end.

CARES provides many resources including a website containing articles, videos, and most importantly, a well-researched Priority List. You do not have to be a CARES member to make use of any of these items. They are free to use and reference by anyone. By looking at these, it seems safe to assume that the viewer has at least a passing interest in the CARES goals and directions. This is wonderful. You certainly do not have to be a member to have the CARES mindset. We are all doing what we can to ensure that our beloved freshwater fish species are

around for the next generation to enjoy. Whether or not you decide to join CARES, our goals are the same. You are most welcome to use any material we have and we heartily endorse any efforts that are aimed towards species survival.





# THE JIM SMITH ENDOWMENT FUND



#### Who Was Jim Smith?

Jim Smith was the Membership Chair for the Ohio Cichlid Association from 1991 to 2003.

Jim was not a big man, but because of his obvious physical and mental toughness, fronted by a calm, friendly demeanor, he was loved and respected by friends and co-workers, who referred to him as "The Buffalo." We in the OCA often called him "Santa," both because of his looks and because of his gentle and patient way with young children.

#### What is the Jim Smith Fund?

Following Jim's passing, in July of 2003, the OCA board knew that something big had to be done to honor Jim's memory. The lead was taken by OCA board member Dan Woodland. Later that year, the OCA announced the establishment of the Jim Smith Fund. The purpose of the fund is to support research, education and conservation efforts that focus on cichlids and catfish.

#### How can I support the Jim Smith Fund?

The OCA has fund-raising activities, such as auctions and raffles at meetings and events, to benefit the Jim Smith Fund. When you support these efforts, you help to fund cichlid and catfish research, education, and conservation projects, and carry on the good work that Jim Smith started many years ago. You can donate fish or aquarium goods at any event, including Sunday's auction. Just right "Donation" on the item, and include your name, if you want. You could also make a cash donation directly to the OCA. Any OCA Board Member can take your donation in person, or you can donate directly at paypal@ohiocichlid.com.

Who are recent Jim Smith Fund grant recipients?

**Ryan Greenway**, a PhD candidate at Kansas State University, was awarded a \$1,000 Jim Smith Fund grant at the 2017 Extravaganza. Ryan is studying the interrelatedness of, and possible hybridization between, 3 species of Thorichthys, living in 4 different areas of the Grijalva River Basin, in Mexico. He will be using the funds to pay for genetic testing. Anton Lamboj, a colleague of Ryan's PhD advisor, Dr. Michael Tobler, accepts the award on his behalf.



Ad Konings recently discovered that the Tropheus duboisi "Maswa" is virtually extinct in Lake Tanganyika, due to over-collecting. In 2017, the Jim Smith Fund gave a \$500 grant to the Stuart Grant Fund, earmarked for obtaining a large group of already captive "Maswa" adults. The intent is to begin a breeding program with the goal of eventually re-establishing a wild population in their original home range. Ad accepts the award, and will oversee the project.



#### Who are recent Jim Smith Fund grant recipients?

At this recent Extravaganza, the Ohio Cichlid Association announced the winner of the 2018 Jim Smith Endowment Fund grant. Jim Smith was a long-time and highly-regarded Membership Chair of the OCA, who passed away in 2003. Later that year, the Jim Smith Fund was established in his memory. The Jim Smith Fund solicits proposals for research, education or conservation projects that deal with cichlids or catfish. Each year, the OCA board votes to determine the best project or projects from the list of applicants, taking in consideration the current balance in the fund.

On November 17, 2018, the Ohio Cichlid Association announced that a team of researchers from McGill University, in Canada, and University of Pará, in Brazil, has won the Jim Smith Fund grant for 2018, and will be awarded \$1700. The team is made up of Oliver Lucanus (McGill), Dr. Margaret Kalacska (McGill) and Dr. Leandro Sousa (Pará).

The driving force behind the team's project is that the incredible fish diversity of the Volta Grande section of the Rio Xingu, in Brazil, is gravely threatened by a variety of human activities. Part of what makes this diversity possible is the unusual and complex bottom structure, which features many different types of rocks, crevices, caves and other features, each used by certain species. This team plans on using photogrammetry (a method of 3-D digital mapping that uses hundreds of photos) to study the bottom of this part of the Rio Xingu.

The idea is to be able to use the data from this mapping, along with 3D printing, to make artificial stand-ins for that section of the Xingu's substrate. These printed structures will be installed in aquariums, ponds or man-made streams. The goal is to get the more difficult-to-breed Xingu species to feel at home enough to reproduce, thereby keeping these species alive in the hobby, even if they go extinct in the wild.

We wish **Oliver, Dr. Kalacska and Dr. Sousa** the best of luck in carrying out their project. We look forward to a personal update on the project's status when Oliver visits to speak at the 2019 Extravaganza, our 25<sup>th</sup> annual show.
