



With Northeast Ohio being the hotbed for cichlid breeders that it is, we have discovered that there seems to be no shortage of world-class speakers locally, a number of which have used the opportunity to talk at OCA meetings to later tour the country with their fantastic presentations. After the talk we usually take a break for refreshments and some socializing among "cichlidiots". This also gives people a chance to look at bowl show entries, and after the break the bowl show winners are announced. Next, Breeder Award Program (BAP) awards are handed out. 
- 2008: \$1,000 was given to support the construction of Anti-Netting Devices in Lake Malawi
- 2009: \$1,000 was donated to the Stewart M. Grant Conservation Fund
- 2010: \$1,000 was donated to the Max Hayes High School to support local education
- 2011: \$2,500 awarded to Jay Stauffer at Penn State to catalog 3,200 collections of Cichlids
- 2012: \$1500 awarded to Jay Stauffer of Penn State University to videograph cichlids in the wild
- 2013: the Jim Smith Fund was able to make two awards, one to Ed Burress for Pike Cichlid research and the other to Ron Coleman for Central American research
- 2014: an award of \$1000 was made to Ad Konings for Tanganyikan breeding facilities
- 2015: Melanie Stiassny received a \$1200 grant to fund attempts to collect live Teleogramma obamaorum. Sam Borstein received \$2000 to study Malawi Cichlid feeding techniques.

The Jim Smith Fund has awarded over \$13K to support Conservation and Education!!

Program Preview January, 2019

"Big" Rich Price By Lew Carbone

"Big" Rich Price is a singular hobbyist. He was born in Berea and grew up in North Royalton, while spending many summers in Florida. A 10-gallon tank, given to him by his uncle, first sparked his interest in fish keeping. Rich says:

"I always knew I wanted bigger tanks right away. I used to spend summers in Florida, snorkeling all day, and got obsessed. When I got older, I bought bigger tanks as I would come across them. Since I had big tanks, people started offering me their big fish. As time went on, I continued buying bigger tanks. In 2017, I started the Ohio Fish Rescue."

OFR is an IRS-recognized non-profit organization. Big Rich uses tax-deductible donations (plus his own money) to support this endeavor. Anyone can buy a cute little Red Tail Catfish, or even an Oscar, at a pet store or some other retailor, and believe that "It'll only grow to the size of its container," as is commonly heard. If they take even moderately good care of the animal, however, it soon grows to a size that most people can't handle. Since people generally recoil at the thought of killing their own pets, OFR fills a real need.

Big Rich, along with his son Josh, maintains tanks of 4400, 3000, 2200 and 2000 gallons, three 1000 gallon tanks, and multiple "smaller" tanks of up to 750 gallons, for a total of 23,000 gallons. To dwarf all that, he's working with a pond specialist on the possibility of turning his 58,000-gallon indoor swimming pool into a pond suitable for both fish-keeping and swimming!

For a day-job, Big Rich manages the many rental properties that he owns. He is very active in the on-line aquarist community, being an admin or moderator for about a dozen FaceBook groups. He also enjoys 4-wheeling, working on hot rods, and keeping other exotic animals.

The title of Big Rich's talk is "The Trials and Tribulations of OFR's 8 Month Fish Rescue".













