



The OCA is proud to bring world class speakers to Ohio, not only for our yearly convention, the OCA Extravaganza, but also for our monthly meetings. With Northeast Ohio being the hotbed for cichlid breeders that it is, we have discovered that there seems to be no shortage of world-class speakers locally, a number of which have used the opportunity to talk at OCA meetings to later tour the country with their fantastic presentations. After the talk we usually take a break for refreshments and some socializing among "cichlidiots". This also gives people a chance to look at bowl show entries, and after the break the bowl show winners are announced. Next, Breeder Award Program (BAP) awards are handed out. We have a Breeder Award Program for cichlids and one for catfish, turning our program into probably the largest one of its kind in the country. The entries are subsequently auctioned off, making some of the newest and rarest cichlids in the hobby available to our members at low auction prices! Program Preview

Jeremy Basch lives in Columbus, OH, but is originally from Westlake, OH. He started keeping fish over 22 years ago when his father took him to a pet shop. Just short of his 17th birthday, Jeremy started working at one of the local fish stores and started to acquire various sized aquariums and fish. He became hooked and setup his first fishroom in 2004.

Currently Jeremy is on his forth modified fishroom design, which now contains 100+ aquariums ranging in size from 2.5 to 150 gallons. Over the years, he has had over 50 species of fish spawn in his aquaria, including many cichlids, catfish, rainbowfish, killifish, livebearers and invertebrates. Jeremy was the first person in the world to have the Jaguar Catfish, *Liosomadoras oncinus*, spawn and give viable offspring!

Jeremy's primary focus is on the cichlids and catfish from South America and killifish from West Africa. He is a current member and the former chairman of his hometown club, the Columbus Area Fish Enthusiasts (CAFÉ). Other fish associations he has belonged to include: the Ohio Cichlid Association, the Greater Cincinnati Aquarium Society, the Catfish Study Group, the American Killifish Association and the American Cichlid Association. He has written a several articles which have appeared in the Buntbarsche Bulletin, the CAFÉ Menu and Amazonas. His article in Amazonas shared his first successful breeding of Liosomadoras oncinus, the Jaguar Catfish. Jeremy can be seen at many fish shows and conventions throughout the Midwest.

On this visit, Jeremy will share with us his knowledge of and experience with Geophagus.

Next month will be our annual Christmas Party buffet. We'll provide turkey, ham and beverages, and we invite you to contribute with a side dish or desert.



Throughout the year, we will be running a number of fund raising activities for the OCA Jim Smith Fund for Conservation and Education. These will include the following:

- Raffling off donated livestock or goods
- 50/50 Raffles during OCA events
- Donated bags of fish will be raffled at club auctions
- Sale of shirts and goody bags donated by Omega/Ad Konings
- Donations will be accepted through a button on the club website

Please consider donating cash, livestock or hardgoods at any OCA event or meeting to help raise money for the Jim Smith Fund. Because of the generous donations of our members and supporters, we have been able provide much needed grants for cichlid or catfish research and conservation! Thanks for your anticipated support!

The Jim Smith Fund is the OCA's endowment fund that annually awards Cichlid and Catfish researchers and others funds to promote Conservation and Education efforts. To date:

- 2008: \$1,000 was given to support the construction of Anti-Netting Devices in Lake Malawi
- 2009: \$1,000 was donated to the Stewart M. Grant Conservation Fund
- 2010: \$1,000 was donated to the Max Hayes High School to support local education
- 2011: \$2,500 awarded to Jay Stauffer at Penn State to catalog 3,200 collections of Cichlids
- 2012: \$1500 awarded to Jay Stauffer of Penn State University to videograph cichlids in the wild
- 2013: the Jim Smith Fund was able to make two awards, one to Ed Burress for Pike Cichlid research and the other to Ron Coleman for Central American research
- 2014: an award of \$1000 was made to Ad Konings for Tanganyikan breeding facilities
- 2015: Melanie Stiassny received a \$1200 grant to fund attempts to collect live Teleogramma obamaorum. Sam Borstein received \$2000 to study Malawi Cichlid feeding techniques.

The Jim Smith Fund has awarded over \$13K to support Conservation and Education!!

STEVEN GRANT



Steven Grant is a UK aquarist who specializes in catfish and loaches.

Steve has kept fish for 30 years, and the first fish he bought was an albino *Corydoras aeneus*. Ever since that moment he has been fascinated with the identity, taxonomy and nomenclature of catfish, despite being hospitalized by a Shovelnose catfish!

He has authored numerous articles for aquarium magazines and the *Catfish Study Group Journal*, and has a large collection of catfish images hosted by scotcat.com. He is also an avid collector of ichthyology books, and his collection includes many rare or out of print books. He has probably bought more books than fish!

Steve has described two species of Corydoras (*C. kanei* and *C. crimmeni*), a replacement name for a species of Mystus, one genus of loach, and four subgenera of woodcats. He has also identified the valid description of a loach in an old aquarium publication, identified the true *Corydoras arcuatus*, and rediscovered the lost syntypes of *Synodontis leopardus* and of *Leiocassis ellenriederii*.

We welcome Steve as he gives his first U.S. presentations.

CHARLEY GRIMES



Charley Grimes, who is an Extravaganza veteran (both as a speaker and an attendee), has been keeping fish for over 50 years. He maintains a fishroom of over 100 aquariums, filled mostly with cichlids and killies. His words:

The mix of fish becomes more eccentric and eclectic as time and opportunity goes on. I find it difficult to ignore a new species when attending various fish auctions.

Over a period of years, he had dug a few backyard ponds he was able to enjoy in the summer, but that phase of his hobby had to be ended for safety reasons.

Charley has also been an avid fish collector and has taken three trips to South America and


one to Mexico. In the spring, he often gets "Native Fish Fever" and collects locally in Indiana and in the southeastern part of the country.

Living in the Indianapolis area, Charley is active with the Circle City Aquarium Club. He is one of the best-known pure hobbyists among US aquarists. His popularity is the result of his aquaristic skill and experience, his personality and sense of humor, and his willingness to share all of the above with others. There is a huge demand for Charley's presentations, especially among the cichlid- and killifish-oriented clubs. He has spoken at American Cichlid Association and American Killifish Association conventions and at four previous OCA Extravaganzas. The culturing of live foods is one of his favorite topics.

On Friday, at 7:15 PM, Charley will present "Cafish, the Grimes Way". Later that evening, he'll retake the stage at 10:15 PM to give his famously hilarious and ever changing "Dead Fish Talk".

WILLEM HEIJNS



Willem lives in the Netherlands, is a retired bank manager, and has been keeping cichlids well over half his lifetime. He started out with the Firemouth (*Thorichthys meeki*) and subsequently has been hooked up with Central American cichlids ever since. Having had small tanks at first, he moved on to build his "Cichlidarium" containing two 600 gallon aquariums and some smaller ones. After some major calamities (two 600g tanks exploded almost in his face) the Cichlidarium was finally closed down in March, 2011.

In the late 80's Willem started collecting cichlids in México and other countries in Central America. Most of these trips he made together with Ad Konings, and some with Juan Miguel Artigas and Don Danko. On the first trips he focussed on collecting cichlids but on later ones Willem tried his hand at shooting video, both above and below the water level.

This has resulted in bringing (new) cichlids into the Dutch hobby, and provided material for a number of films, a compilation of which is available on the DVD *México*, a *Journey into the World of Cichlids*.

Willem's last four trips were made to Nicaragua. Searching for cichlids, he visited most of the crater lakes in this beautiful country. He concentrated on Laguna Xiloá, where he put his diver's license to good use, and was able to get video footage from depths of 20 meters or more. This footage was edited to produce the DVD *Nicaragua, Cichlids from the Crater*, which is also available to the public.

No longer keeping cichlids, Willem is now concentrating on writing and giving presentations around the globe. He has published a number of articles about cichlids in magazines worldwide, and has also co-authored a book on these wonderful fishes. His

main area of interest is the evolution and systematics of Neotropical cichlids belonging to a group informally known as "Heroine cichlids".

Here are Willem's descriptions of his talks for this weekend:

"Nicaragua, Searching for Cichlids" (Friday, 6:00 PM)

Besides visiting the craterlakes, I have also travelled other parts of Nicaragua extensively. This presentation is a travelogue of these trips. It contains footage of the cichlids occurring in the rivers in the northern and eastern parts of Nicaragua.

"Heroine Cichlids: An Addiction?" (Saturday, 10:15 AM)

An introduction to a fascinating (addictive?) group of Neotropical cichlids. The presentation addresses three questions: 1. What are Heroine cichlids? 2. Where can Heroine cichlids be found? 3. How can heroine cichlids be recognized? Every effort has been made to avoid technical terms and reach out to the hobbyist. To that purpose the presentation is also richly illustrated with fish pictures as well as video.

LAWRENCE KENT



Faso, Mauritania, and Egypt.

Lawrence Kent works for a charitable foundation fighting hunger and poverty in the developing world. He hails from New Jersey, lives in Seattle, and travels frequently, for his job, to Africa and Asia.

Lawrence takes advantage of his travels to look for interesting tropical fish in places as diverse as Cambodia, Colombia, Uganda, and Benin. He has collected fish in 14 African countries and lived for 10 years in Chad, Burkina

At home, Lawrence keeps 25 aquaria, many stocked with cichlids he collected abroad (He pays his son \$9 a day to feed the fish when he travels.) A regular contributor to the *Buntbarsche Bulletin*, *Tropical Fish Hobbyist*, and *Cichlid News*, Lawrence is fascinated by all types of fish, birds, and reptiles, and the challenge of correctly identifying and breeding them.

At 11:30 AM on Saturday, Lawrence will present "Looking for Fish in Tricky Places: Nigeria and the Congo".


