
















### September Program Preview Nick Zarlinga "Project Piaba"

Ever since I was a kid, fish have always been my first love. My first aquarium was a new, shiny, metal-edged 5-gallon aquarium that my dad gave me. I was very excited and proceeded to go out in the yard and grab some of the white landscape gravel to cover the bottom. That same day I added 10 goldfish, only to watch the water get cloudy and the goldfish die a couple days later. It was that first aquarium that taught me some of life's most important lessons. Lesson #1: Animals die; Lesson #2: water quality; Lesson #3: animal welfare. After recovering from the trauma, it was this first experience that kicked in a lifelong quest for learning about all things aquatic. I am still learning today.



I was born and raised here in Cleveland and all I knew was that I wanted to do something with animals when I grew up. During my teenage years, I had to work to pay for college, and as for many of us, one of those jobs was working at a pet store. I worked weekends there while attending Akron University getting my bachelor's degree in biology and ecology. Just before I was to graduate, a younger coworker of mine, who was volunteering at the Cleveland Metroparks Zoo, tipped me off to a position in the aquarium. When I inquired, I was told they had an applicant they were just about to hire but "thank you for your interest". Undaunted, and with a swagger that only a college student possesses, I plead for an interview, saying "I can compete with anyone you may have in mind". In an attempt to get rid of me, the curator asked me the following question, "What is the life cycle of an octopus?". Well, I happened to know the answer, and the other complicated ones to follow. That was 27 years ago last month. I am one of those few people who got to make their "vacation their vocation". I really don't know what I would do if I had to work for a living.

During my career at the zoo, I have been fortunate to work with a wide variety of aquatic animals, from guppies to sharks and jellies to octopuses. I have also had the wonderful opportunity to travel around the world both for work and for pleasure. One of my most favorite trips was to the Rio Negro with Project Piaba. I am delighted to be able to share the highlights of this trip with you and to talk to you about this very worthwhile conservation project.

Nick is the head aquarist at the Cleveland Metroparks Zoo. His presentation will be about Project Piaba, a program that both brings wild fish into the hobby in a sustainable manner and helps protect the Brazilian rainforest.

Next month, John Krepper, a veteran aquarist from Indianapolis, will be our online guest. His talk will be "Tanganyican Treasurers – Featherfins and Sand Dwellers in the Aquarium".

#### 2020 OCA Monthly Bowl Show Competition Rules

The primary purpose of the bowl show is educational and practice for the annual Extravaganza. It enables members to see and examine different species of fish, it familiarizes members as to judging procedures. In addition to encouraging the showing and keeping of fish.

- 1. The Bowl Show Chairman, or designated appointee for a specific month, shall have complete charge of all entries. Any unusual requirements or exceptions or questions about these rules must be discussed with the chairperson.
- 2. All entries shall be in containers having at least 1 flat side (not including the bottom). Only one fish per container, unless a full divider is used then only one fish per section of the container. It's also a good idea to have some form of lid for your animal's protection.
- 3. All containers must be devoid of contents, except for water and fish. A background, outside of the container, is allowed. However, special lighting is not allowed.
- 4. A label (piece of paper) should be placed in front of each entry giving the scientific name and the class the fish is being entered. The owner's name (the person[s] receiving points) of the entry should be placed on the back of the label.
- 5. Only members in good standing and present at the monthly meeting may submit an entry.
- 6. No more than 6 entries may be submitted by any one member during a monthly show.
- 7. Entries must be owned by the person(s) submitting it for judging. In addition, the last permeant residence of the entry must be from an aquarium maintained by the owner(s).
- 8. The chairperson, from time to time, may ask for guest judges in helping to award points. However, the final decision to award any points is the responsibility of the chairperson.
- 9. Each month different categories, typically Cichlids and Catfish, will be judged. Checkout the most current listing for monthly classes.
- 10. Size restrictions refer to full-grown adult sizes as reported by Cichlid Room Companion or Planet Catfish.
- 11. A fish can be entered in only one of the available classes, each month.
- 12. Diseased, malformed, mutilated, hybrid specimens, or other reasonable grounds may be cause for disqualification of an entry. If an entry is disqualified, then all points and cash prizes accumulated for that month's show will be forfeit by the owner(s) that submitted the entry.
- 13. The decision of the chairperson is FINAL.
- 14. Monthly Point awards and cash prizes: (OCA to potentially award \$81, and 65 points to all placing entries, per month)

- 15. Yearly Point awards and prizes:
  - 1. Grand Prize for 2020: 75-gallon aquarium or cash equivalent. To qualify for the grand prize, you must have earned points in at least three separate monthly shows.
  - 2. A Certificate (or plaque) will be awarded to the OCA Bowl Show Champion (overall point leader for the year). To qualify for the certificate, you must have earned points in at least three separate monthly shows.
  - 3. Certificates may be awarded to the 1<sup>st</sup> runner-up in the yearly point totals. To qualify for a certificate, you must have earned points in at least three separate monthly shows and have at least half the total points as the overall point leader.
  - 4. For tie breakers, the number of monthly awards won will be utilized starting with Best of Show.

### VIRTUAL BAP!

Temporary guidelines for temporary times (Hopefully, soon! We miss you all!)

#### **OCA BAP Submissions during COVID! - Temporary Procedure**

To keep members engaged with the club we would like to offer the ability to virtually submit spawns for the Breeder Awards Program. During this unprecedented time we would like to give hobbyists the ability to get credit for the proliferation of cichlids and catfish. This means we will be suspending the requirement to turn in the fish at a monthly meeting, and instead members will need to submit a photo of fry (and parents if available), along with a completed form, by email. Note this is only a temporary procedure. BAP will return to the normal process/expectations when in-person meetings resume. Also, all standard size and number minimums must be honored. Here's what you need to do to participate:

1. Take a photo (a decent cellphone photo will do) of multiple fry, and if possible, a photo of the parents. Show at least the number of fry that is the minimum turn-in number for that species. When photographing the fry, include in the photo, by writing on the tank or attaching an index card to the glass, that day's date.

2. Download the fillable form PDF from our website. <u>https://www.ohiocichlid.com/meetings/bap-virtual</u> (See step 2 there, also.)

3. Fill out the form on your phone or computer and save. If you prefer, you can print the form, fill it out by hand, and scan or photograph the completed form.

3. Attach the form and photo(s) to an email, and send to <u>buckeyebulletin@gmail.com</u>. Please send only one species per email, but you can send multiple submissions each month.

If you choose to write an article on the spawn, it will be included in our monthly bulletin. Don't worry if you're writing skills aren't the best, because we can edit it into something you can be proud of. It is strongly encouraged that if a species is turned in by this virtual method, at a future in-person meeting, the species is still submitted for the mini-auction. This is in keeping with one of the purposes of the Breeders' Award Program, which is to make a variety of species available to our members in this manner.

Your submissions will be announced at the OCA monthly Zoom meeting and published in the monthly bulletin. For a submission to be credited for that month, it must be submitted by the Sunday before the meeting. (Meetings are always the 1st Friday of the month.) If you miss a monthly deadline, it'll be credited for the next month. As always, each month's BAP submissions won't be included in the official reported totals until the following month's bulletin.

As in all BAP, there is an element of "the honor system" involved. Let's keep this fun for everyone!



### OCA Virtual Extravaganza 2020 and the Jim Smith Fund

Our Virtual Extravaganza 2020, which is scheduled for Nov 20-22, will basically be a fundraiser for the Jim Smith Endowment Fund. Here are answers to FAQs about the JSF and how you can help by participating in the Virtual Extravaganza, and how the Donors' Award can help you:

#### Who Was Jim Smith?

Jim Smith was the Membership Chair for the Ohio Cichlid Association from 1991 to 2003. Jim was not a big man, but because of his obvious physical and mental toughness, fronted by a calm, friendly demeanor, he was loved and respected by friends and co-workers, who referred to him as "The Buffalo". We in the OCA often called him "Santa", both because of his looks and because of his gentle and patient way with young children.

#### What is the Jim Smith Fund?

Following Jim's passing, in July of 2003, the OCA board knew that something big had to be done to honor Jim's memory. The lead was taken by OCA board member Dan Woodland. Later that year, the OCA announced the establishment of the Jim Smith Endowment Fund. The purpose of the fund is to support research, education and conservation efforts that focus on cichlids and catfish.

#### What has the JSF done so far?

The fund has awarded over \$20,000 in grant money. Here are some examples:

2008: \$1,000 was given to support the construction of Anti-Netting Devices in Lake Malawi.

2009: \$1,000 was donated to the Stewart M. Grant Conservation Fund.

2011: \$2,500 awarded to Jay Stauffer at Penn State to catalog a collection of preserved cichlids.

2012: \$1500 awarded to Jay Stauffer to record video of cichlid behavior in Lake Malawi.

2013: \$1500 was given to Ed Burress for pike cichlid research; \$1,000 was given to Ron Coleman to study Costa Rican cichlids

2014: \$1000 was given to Ad Konings for Tanganyikan captive breeding facilities.

2015: \$1200 to Melanie Stiassny to collect live Teleogramma obamaorum; \$2000 to Sam Borstein to study Malawi cichlid feeding techniques.

2016: \$2000 to Mark Sabaj to organize the historic Cope Collection at Drexel University.

2017: \$1000 to Ryan Greenway to study Thorichthys; \$500 to Ad Konings to obtain T. duboisi

"Maswa" breeding stock to eventually reintroduce the species into Lake Tanganyika.

2018: \$1700 to Oliver Lucanus and team to 3D map parts of the Xingu River substrate.

2019: Joe Cutler, a National Geographic Explorer, won the 2019 Jim Smith Award grant for \$2000 toward his project "The Ogooué Megatransect", a major expedition along most of the Ogooué River, in Gabon, to survey the river and collect fish samples. The goal is to convince the Gabonese government to either abandon a proposed dam project or take steps to minimize the damage to local ecosystems. At the very least, it will document the river's habitats as they are now. That expedition is going on as I type, and you can follow Joe's exploits on his FB page and on Instagram: @africaslastwildriver


#### How will the OCA Virtual Extravaganza 2020 help the Jim Smith Fund?

# Virtual Fish Show

#### 2020 Virtual Extravaganza

Exhibitor Qualifications

- Any hobbyist may enter who registers for the 2020 Virtual Extravaganza and pays the fee of \$5.00 per entry. OCA membership is not required.
- 2. Limit of 10 entries per exhibitor.
- 3. No entry will be in more than one class.
- 4. Entry shall consist of a 15 30 second video, showing all possible angles of the fish.
- 5. Fish may NOT be removed from the water during the video.
- 6. A ruler/tape measure must be displayed against the glass to show the size of the fish



- 7. Fish does NOT need to be displayed in a bare show tank (but if the judges cannot see It, it will be disqualified or points taken down)
- 8. Any fish deemed a hybrid by the Judges will automatically be disqualified (including Aulonacara).

#### Entry Deadlines

- 1. All entries, entry fees, and entry forms must be received between October 1<sup>st</sup> and October 31<sup>st</sup>.
- 2. *E-mail entries to jeffnatterer@gmail.com after paying the entry fee in the OCA online store.*

#### Judging

- 1. Judging will take place from November 1<sup>st</sup> through November 18th. With the results revealed live online on November 22<sup>nd</sup> In the Virtual Extravaganza room.
- 2. Decisions of the judges and show chairman on class changes, disqualifications, and show results will be final.
- 3. Any videos entered in classes 1-9 showing any signs of enhanced editing (other than trimming clips to fit the time constraints) *WILL BE AUTOMATICALLY DISQUALIFIED*.

#### Equipment

- 1. The OCA will provide a group on Facebook where the videos will be posted with only their class number, and entry number for the exhibitor to remain anonymous until after judging.
- 2. The exhibitor will provide a 30 second video showing their entry from all possible angles, and a ruler against the glass for size comparison.
- 3. Fish MUST be displayed in a container (tank) having a flat viewing side.

#### **General Rules**

- 1. All videos will be under control of the Show Chairman and Judges.
- 2. We, the OCA, will do our utmost to ensure the highest amount of care and security is given to each entry.
- 3. Only one entry per e-mail will be accepted and must include the scientific name of your fish, class number, exhibitors full name as they want it displayed and video added as an attachment.
- 4. The emails/entries will be cross referenced with the OCA online store to confirm payment of entry fee.
- 5. Nonpayment of entry fee will be automatic disqualification.
- 6. NO entries will be accepted via US Postal service or any other means other than the one listed in these rules.
- 7. Payouts for each class are as follows.: First Place: \$20:00, Second Place: \$10.00, Third Place : \$5.00
- 8. Payouts for the other awards are as follows: Best In Show (cichlid) \$100.00, Reserve Best Of Show (cichlid) \$50.00, Best Catfish in Show \$100.00, Memorial Trophy \$75.00, Best Video In Show 50.00.
- 9. Prize amounts MAY change (up) as the show nears, and there *WILL be special trophies given out to Best Of Show and Best Catfish Of Show.*
- 10. Class 11 shall be judged strictly off of video content and quality, not off of the fish in the video AND can be 60sec. in length and will be professionally judged by an IMDB accredited Hollywood producer.
- 11. Video Class must be hobby related, be shot by the entrant and MUST contain cichlids or catfish.


#### Challenge

#### Who are recent Jim Smith Fund grant recipients?

**Ryan Greenway**, a PhD candidate at Kansas State University, was awarded a \$1,000 Jim Smith Fund grant at the 2017 Extravaganza. Ryan is studying the interrelatedness of, and possible hybridization between, 3 species of Thorichthys, living in 4 different areas of the Grijalva River Basin, in Mexico. He will be using the funds to pay for genetic testing. Anton Lamboj, a colleague of Ryan's PhD advisor, Dr. Michael Tobler, accepts the award on his behalf.



**Ad Konings** recently discovered that the Tropheus duboisi "Maswa" is virtually extinct in Lake Tanganyika, due to over-collecting. In 2017, the Jim Smith Fund gave a \$500 grant to the Stuart Grant Fund, earmarked for obtaining a large group of already captive "Maswa" adults. The intent is to begin a breeding program with the goal of eventually re-establishing a wild population in their original home range. Ad accepts the award, and will oversee the project.



#### Who are recent Jim Smith Fund grant recipients?

At this recent Extravaganza, the Ohio Cichlid Association announced the winner of the 2018 Jim Smith Endowment Fund grant. Jim Smith was a long-time and highly-regarded Membership Chair of the OCA, who passed away in 2003. Later that year, the Jim Smith Fund was established in his memory. The Jim Smith Fund solicits proposals for research, education or conservation projects that deal with cichlids or catfish. Each year, the OCA board votes to determine the best project or projects from the list of applicants, taking in consideration the current balance in the fund.

On November 17, 2018, the Ohio Cichlid Association announced that a team of researchers from McGill University, in Canada, and University of Pará, in Brazil, has won the Jim Smith Fund grant for 2018, and will be awarded \$1700. The team is made up of Oliver Lucanus (McGill), Dr. Margaret Kalacska (McGill) and Dr. Leandro Sousa (Pará).


The driving force behind the team's project is that the incredible fish diversity of the Volta Grande section of the Rio Xingu, in Brazil, is gravely threatened by a variety of human activities. Part of what makes this diversity possible is the unusual and complex bottom structure, which features many different types of rocks, crevices, caves and other features, each used by certain species. This team plans on using photogrammetry (a method of 3-D digital mapping that uses hundreds of photos) to study the bottom of this part of the Rio Xingu.

The idea is to be able to use the data from this mapping, along with 3D printing, to make artificial stand-ins for that section of the Xingu's substrate. These printed structures will be installed in aquariums, ponds or man-made streams. The goal is to get the more difficult-tobreed Xingu species to feel at home enough to reproduce, thereby keeping these species alive in the hobby, even if they go extinct in the wild.

We wish **Oliver, Dr. Kalacska and Dr. Sousa** the best of luck in carrying out their project. We look forward to a personal update on the project's status when Oliver visits to speak at the 2019 Extravaganza, our 25<sup>th</sup> annual show.
